DeWitt Wins 2nd Mid-Amateur Championship

Rick DeWitt's victory in the 1994 Colorado Golf Association Mid-Amateur Championship at Lakewood Country Club on October 1 makes it fours year in a row that this CGA championship has been won by someone named "Rick."

DeWitt himself started the "Rick-fest" in 1991, was helped by two straight from Fox Hollow's "Rick" Garber in 1992 and 1993 and continued the string himself in 1994. Having the first name of Rick is not, in itself, enough to win this prestigious CGA title — it also helps if you can play

a little golf. DeWitt took the 1994 field by the throat with a second-round 65 which gave him a six-stroke cushion going into the final round. He coasted in with a fiveover-par 76 in the closing round to give him a three-day total of two-under-par 211 and a two-shot win over Mark Hirsch of Meadow Hills Golf Course.

By the way, defending champion Rick Garber finished third among Ricks in the 1994 event. Garber finished tied for 13th, 13 strokes behind DeWitt and one behind "Rick" VanDyke of Lakewood Country Club.
