Race Driver Dies In Florida Crash, Second Injured

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — (AP) — A 30-year-old Atlanta sports car driver was killed and a Tampa driver injured Saturday following a spinout on a turn in the second lap of a Paul Whiteman Trophy race.

David Pearl was killed on the west infield turn of the 3.18 mile road course at the Daytona International Speedway. Pearl's Brabham B. T. 29 spun out and stalled in the center of the track and was hit broadside by Milo Vega's Lola T202 Formula Ford.

Vega of Tampa was hospitalized with a broken left wrist, fractured ankle and bruises. The race was halted while track officials worked for more than 15 minutes to remove the trapped driver from his Formula F racer.

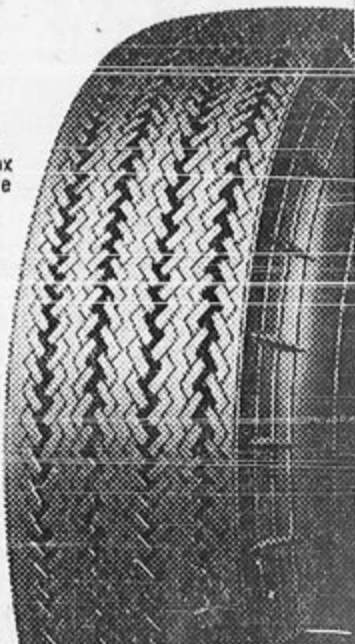
