

# Golden wins state seniors crown

John Golden of Evergreen shot a 4-over-par 76 to win the 1995 Colorado Golf Association Senior Stroke Play Championship yesterday at Mira Vista Golf Course.

Golden has swept both the Senior Match Play Championship and Senior Stroke Play Championship for the second time. The first time was in 1993.

John Hamer of Boulder shot a 2-over-par 74 to finish one behind. Larry Brown also posted a 74 to finish alone in third place. Last year's champion, Roger Gunderson of Aurora, finished tied for fourth with Bert Welz of Littleton, four strokes behind.

Ed Coover of Westminster shot a 71 and was the only player to post a sub-par round on the former Lowry Air Force Base golf course.

Former University of Colorado golf coach Les Fowler of Boulder won the Super Seniors, finishing tied for 10th place with a 229. The Super Senior trophy is awarded to the low gross individual over 65 years of age.
